



Preserving & restoring historical locations and nature reserves

In partnership with the National Park Service, the **Accokeek Foundation** stewards 200 acres of Piscataway Park in Prince George's County, Md. At the Foundation's National Colonial Farm, a living history museum, visitors can experience award-winning museum theater performances, heritage breed animals, and colonial architecture. The Center for Agricultural and Environmental Stewardship provides educational workshops and forums, plus innovative beginning farmer training at the modern Ecosystem Farm. The Accokeek Foundation serves as an outdoor classroom for thousands of students every year. Visitors love the Foundation's trails, birds and wildlife, fishing pier, and spectacular view of George Washington's Mount Vernon on the Potomac River.

Restore Mass Ave is an alliance of residents, foreign missions, arborists, and non-profit groups working to rebuild the tree canopy and historic landscape of Massachusetts Avenue in northwest DC. Restore Mass Ave attracts participation by property owners (one-third of which are foreign missions) through outreach and education. The organization arranges for the planting of new trees, replacement of dying trees, and care for all new and vulnerable trees. Since its inception, Restore Mass Ave has planted nearly 100 trees on and around Embassy Row.
